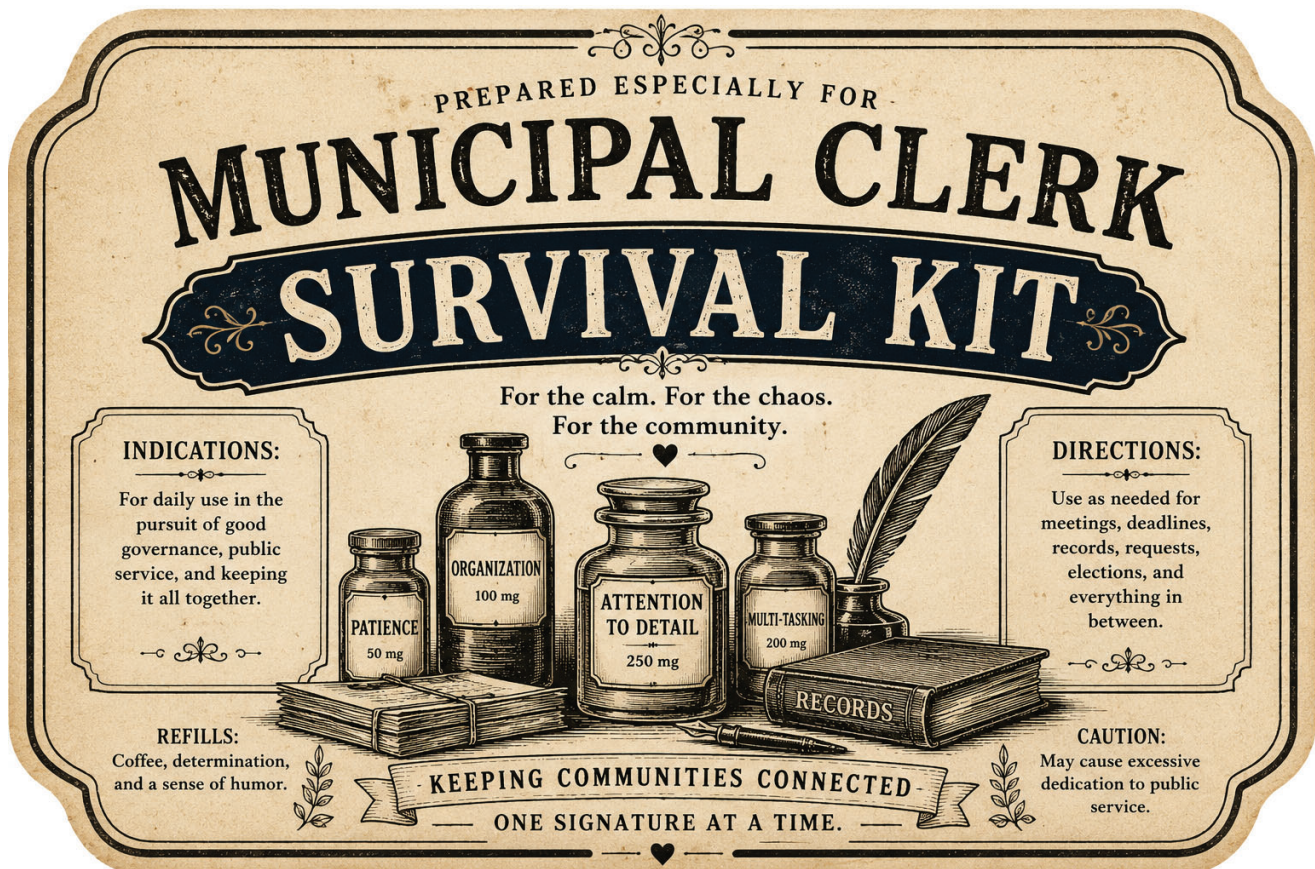

Regional Buzz

Regional Group Spotlights from Institute & Academy

DMWRA consists of Davis, Morgan, and Weber County recorders and clerks. They consist of 51 active members covering 31 cities in those counties. The DMWRA board for 2026 consists of Cynthia Benson of Harrisville, President, Michelle Marigoni of Riverdale, Vice-President, Morghan Yeoman of Hooper, Treasurer, and Katie Hansen of West Point, Secretary. DMWRA meets ten (10) times a year for what they call Lunch & Learns. This year they have held these Lunch & Learns on the recorder's role in community development, statutory requirements regarding budgets, and an open forum about the recent legislative updates.

GSLCR or better known as Greater Salt Lake. Over the past year, this region has focused on election member engagement and strengthening connections between our cities. They have facilitated an Athenian dialogue for members to gain points. They've hosted several lunches and built relationships in foster communities. They currently have 33 cities with 45 active members. This year, they're continuing to build on the momentum by increasing engagement and offering a full schedule of training including cemetery, historic preservation, and opportunities for members to connect with luncheons. They had a recent training course with the Draper City Attorney on writing ordinances and resolutions.

BRAG consists of Box Elder, Cache, and Rich counties with Holly Jones as President, Dana Lazcanotegui as first vice president, Anita Nicholas as second vice president, and Misty Moesser as secretary. They meet once a quarter for a lunch meeting. Their first quarter meeting was about training, not only for clerks and recorders, but also the training they need to be aware of for our

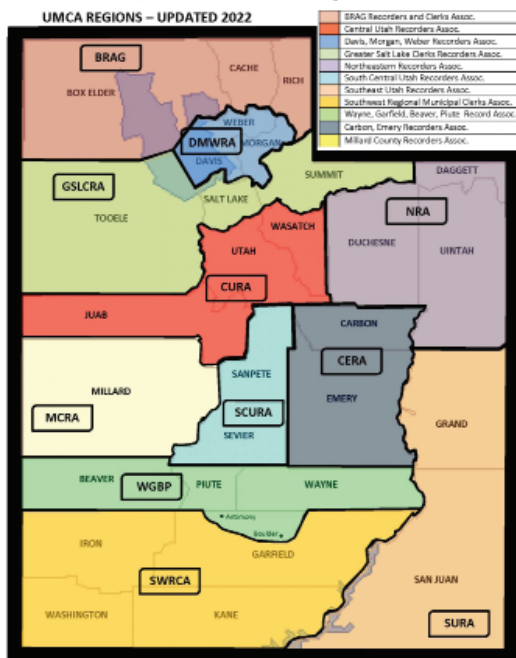
newly elected officials and new staff. Their next quarterly meeting will be on truth and taxation. Ms. Jones commented on how much she appreciates and is grateful for the remarkable recorders they have in their region and their willingness to happily help each other.

CURA encompasses the counties of Utah, Wasatch, and Juab and is made up of an awesome group of women and men. Stephanie Cottle is president, Heidi Allman is vice-president, and Teresa McKittrick is treasurer, Amalie Ottley is secretary.

They have about 50 members, and meet monthly, which they feel is wonderful, because they have a lot of really great networking that happens in their group. They learn a lot from each other. This year, their theme is taken from the book, *The Speed of Trust*, where they are learning about the keys of successful leadership. Every month, they learn about a different key. So far, they have discussed how trust plays a big role in our roles, how it's important to right the wrongs, and how it's important to talk straight. They have also had training on ethics and legislative bill tracking. Their next training will be data privacy and security.

SCURA is located in the center of the state and consists of Sanpete and Sevier counties. They have accomplished a lot of different things over the past year. Their participation has improved considerably over the past year. The largest city they have in their area is Richfield. They see their region as small communities helping other small communities. They readily email each other and share items to help each other do what they do. They have three (3) gentlemen in their group now. In their group, it is basically the city recorder, no city man-agers, along with the city council, running these tiny communities.

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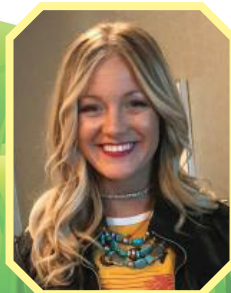
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
